5	SECTION 1. Subsection (4) of Section 4 of S.L. 2015-245, as amended by Section			
6	2(b) of S.L. 2016-121, reads as rewritten:			
7	"(4) Service	es covered by PHPs Capitated PHP contracts shall cover all Medicaid		
8	and NC Health Choice services, including physical health services, prescription			
9	drugs, long-term services and supports, and behavioral health services for NC			
10	Health Choice recipients, except as otherwise provided in this subdivision. The			
11	capitated contracts required by this subdivision shall not cover:			
12	a.	Behavioral health services for Medicaid recipients currently covered by		
13		the local management entities/managed care organizations		
14		(LME/MCOs) for four years after the date capitated contracts begin.		
15	b.	Dental services.		
16	с.	Services provided through the Program of All-Inclusive Care for the		
17		Elderly (PACE).		
18	d.	Audiology, speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy,		
19		nursing, and psychological services prescribed in an Individualized		
20		Education Program (IEP) and performed by schools or individuals		
21		contracted with Local Education Agencies.		
22	e.	Services provided directly by a Children's Developmental Services		
23		Agency (CDSA) or by a provider under contract with a CDSA if the		
24		service is authorized through the CDSA and is included on the child's		
25		Individualized Family Service Plan.		
26	f.	Services for Medicaid program applicants during the period of time		
27	prior to eligibility determination.			
28	<u>g.</u>	The fabrication of eyeglasses, including complete eyeglasses, eyeglass		
29		lenses, and ophthalmic frames."		
30	<b>SECTION 2.</b>	This act is effective when it becomes law.
