5	SECTION 1. This act shall be known as the "National and State Mottos in Schools				
6	Act."				
7	SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-47 reads as rewritten:

9	In addition to the powers and duties designated in G.S. 115C-36, local boards of education				
10	shall have the power or duty:

12	(29a) To Require the Display of the United States and North Carolina Flags, Flags				
13	and of the National and State Mottos and to Require the Recitation of the				
14	Pledge of Allegiance. – Local boards of education shall adopt policies to (i)				
15	require the display of the United States and North Carolina flags in each				
16	classroom, when available, (ii)(ii) require the display of the national motto,				
17	"In God We Trust," and the State motto, "To Be Rather Than to Seem," in at				
18	least one prominent location of each school, such as an entry way, cafeteria,				
19	or other common area, (iii) require that recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance				
20	be scheduled on a daily basis, and (iii)(iv) provide age-appropriate instruction				
21	on the meaning and historical origins of the flag and the Pledge of Allegiance.
