A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO REVISE THE JUDICIAL DIVISIONS; TO CLARIFY LISTING OF JUDICIAL 3 SEATS ON THE BALLOT; AND TO LIMIT ROTATION OF SUPERIOR COURT 4 JUDGES TO SIX MONTHS PER YEAR. 5

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

7 The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court "(a) 8 districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident 9 superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, 10 as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

G.S. 7A-47.3 reads as rewritten: 11 "§ 7A-47.3. Rotation and assignment; sessions. 12 To effect the intent of Article IV, Section 11 of the North Carolina Constitution, each (a) 13 regular resident superior court judge may, upon each rotation, be assigned to hold the courts 14 either of one of the districts or of one of the sets of districts, as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1(a), 15 districts in that judge's judicial division. 16 All sessions of superior court shall be for an entire county, whether that county (b) 17 comprises or is located in a district or in a set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A 41.1(a), and at 18 each session all matters and proceedings arising anywhere in the county shall be heard. 19 In making assignment of the judges of the superior court, the Chief Justice of the (c) 20 Supreme Court shall strive to allow each regular resident superior court judge to be assigned to the district or set of districts from which that regular resident superior court judge was elected or 21 22 appointed no less than one half of the calendar year. 23 For purposes of this section, "district or set of districts" shall have the same meaning (d)

24 <u>as in G.S. 7A-41.1(a).</u>"

25 SECTION 5. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes
26 law.
