A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR GRANTS TO CERTAIN MILK PRODUCERS TO ALLEVIATE NEGATIVE FOOD SUPPLY CHAIN IMPACTS DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Findings. - The General Assembly finds that the COVID-19 SECTION 1. 7 emergency has resulted in serious and substantial impacts on the food supply chain, including 8 the State's dairy industry. Dairy producers and processors in the State lost more than half of their 9 market with COVID-19 related shutdowns of the school systems and food service industries. 10 This resulted in milk being dumped and a devastating decrease in milk pay prices, which were already at a historical low. The additional bottlenecks caused by shutdowns in the meat 11 processing plants and lack of facilities to process dairy animals for beef left producers with no 12 income options from the sale of cows culled from their herds. The General Assembly further 13 14 finds that financial assistance to these producers is necessary in order to reduce disruptions in the 15 supply chain for fresh dairy products and to help dairy producers in the State stay in business.

16 SECTION 2.(a) Transfer of Funds from Reserves to Relief Fund. – The State 17 Controller shall transfer the sum of four million one hundred four thousand dollars (\$4,104,000) 18 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year from the Coronavirus Relief Reserve established in Section 2.1 of 19 S.L. 2020-4 to the Coronavirus Relief Fund established in Section 2.2 of S.L. 2020-4.

SECTION 2.(b) Appropriation of Funds from Relief Fund. – There is appropriated from the Fund to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services the sum of four million one hundred four thousand dollars (\$4,104,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to be allocated and used as provided in Section 3 of this act. The funds appropriated in this section must be expended by December 30, 2020, and funds not expended on that date shall revert at the end of the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

SECTION 3.(a) Allocation of Funds. – The funds appropriated by Section 2 of this 26 27 act shall be allocated to the North Carolina Dairy Stabilization and Growth Fund to provide grants 28 as specified in subsection (b) of this section to compensate eligible dairy producers for losses 29 incurred as a result of the collapse in dairy prices due to the COVID-19 pandemic or to improve the resiliency and adaptability of the dairy supply chain to future pandemics. These funds may 30 31 only be used for purposes consistent with the April 22, 2020, "Coronavirus Relief Fund Guidance 32 for State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments" provided by the United States Department 33 of the Treasury or with any subsequent act of Congress.

34 **SECTION 3.(b)** Grant Procedures. – The Department shall develop policies and 35 procedures for the disbursement of grants that include, at a minimum, the following:
