3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
4	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-4.01 reads as rewritten:				
5	"§ 20-4.01. Definitions.				
6	Unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply throughout this				
7	Chapter to the defined words and phrases and their cognates:

21		deemed vehicles and every rider of a bicycle or an electric assisted bicycle

2	(1) A marker that clearly states the name and contact information of the owner		
3	and a unique identification number.		
4	(2) <u>A braking system that enables the device to come to a controlled stop.</u>		
5	(3) When operated at night, lights on the front and rear of the personal delivery		
6	device that are visible and recognizable under normal atmospheric conditions		
7	from at least 500 feet on all sides of the personal delivery device.		
8	(d) A violation of this section is an infraction.		
9	"§ 20-175.9. Local regulation.		
10	For the purpose of assuring the safety of persons using highways and sidewalks, a local		
11	government having jurisdiction over public streets, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, and other ways of		
12	public passage may by ordinance regulate time and place of the operation of personal delivery		
13	devices, but shall not prohibit their use.

15	<u>A business entity that operates a personal delivery device under this Part shall maintain an</u>		
16	insurance policy that includes general liability coverage of not less than one hundred thousand		
17	dollars (\$100,000) per claim for damages arising from the operation of the personal delivery		
18	device."		
19	<b>SECTION 3.(a)</b> G.S. 20-175.9, as enacted by Section 2 of this act, reads as rewritten:		
20	"§ 20-175.9. Local regulation.		
21	For the purpose of assuring the safety of persons using highways and sidewalks, a local		
22	government having jurisdiction over public streets, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, and other ways of		
23	public passage may by ordinance regulate the time and place of the operation of personal delivery		
24	devices, but shall not prohibit their use.prohibit operation of personal delivery devices within its		
25	jurisdiction if the local government determines that the prohibition is necessary."		
26	<b>SECTION 3.(b)</b> This section becomes effective December 1, 2022. Any ordinance		
27	regulating time and place of operation of personal delivery devices adopted by a local		
28	government in accordance with G.S. 20-175.9 before the effective date of this section shall		
29	remain in effect until repealed by that local government.		
30	<b>SECTION 4.</b> G.S. 20-146.2(a)(4) reads as rewritten:		
31	"(4) Plug-in electric vehicles as defined in $G.S. 20-4.01(28a)$ , $G.S. 20-4.01(28b)$ ,		
32	regardless of the number of passengers in the vehicle. These vehicles must be		
33	able to travel at the posted speed limit while operating in the HOV lane."		
34	<b>SECTION 5.</b> G.S. 20-183.2(b)(9) reads as rewritten:		
35	"(9) It is not a plug-in electric vehicle as defined in		
36	<del>G.S. 20-4.01(28a).</del> <u>G.S. 20-4.01(28b).</u> "		
37	<b>SECTION 6.</b> G.S. 20-286(10) is amended by adding a new sub-subdivision to read:		
38	"c. <u>The term "motor vehicle" does not include an electrically powered</u>		
39	device that is equipped with automated driving technology that		
40	enables device operation with or without remote support and		
41	supervision of a human, and to which all of the following apply: (i) the		
42	device does not exceed a weight of 750 pounds, excluding cargo, (ii)		
43	the device does not exceed a length of 40 inches when not linked with		
44	other devices, and (iii) the device does not exceed a width of 36 inches.		
45	An electrically powered device that is equipped with automated		
46	driving technology that enables device operation with or without		
47	remote support and supervision of a human and that exceeds any of		
48	the dimensions set out in this sub-subdivision is included in the term		
49	"motor vehicle" under this Article, and the device is subject to the		
50	provisions of Article 18 of this Chapter if it falls within the definition		
51	of "fully autonomous vehicle" under G.S. 20-400(3)."

SECTION 7. Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective December 1,
2020, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
