	provided in this Article. This Article shall be liberally construed to effectuate those public			
	purposes. The provisions of this Article are severable. If any part of this Article is declared to be			
	invalid by a court, the invalidity does not affect other parts of this Article that can be given effect			
	without the	invalid provision."
