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HOUSE BILL 795 PROPOSED SENATE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE H795-PCS10871-BB-38

Short Title: Open Amusement Parks/Arcades/Playgrounds. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: April 18, 2019 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AMUSEMENT PARKS, GAMING AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS WITH VIDEO GAMES AND ARCADE GAMES, AND PUBLIC PLAYGROUNDS TO RESUME OPERATIONS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.(a)** Notwithstanding Executive Order No. 141, Easing Restrictions on Travel, Business Operations, and Mass Gatherings: Phase Two, issued by Governor Roy A. Cooper on May 20, 2020, any establishment that is an (i) amusement park or (ii) gaming and business establishment with video games and arcade games, as referenced in Section 8 of Executive Order No. 141, may open and resume operations provided all of the following apply: The establishment was in existence on March 10, 2020, or had a valid certificate of occupancy and business license issued by that date. Total capacity is limited to fifty percent (50%) of the authorized fire capacity. (2) (3) All employees answer a health questionnaire and have their temperature taken daily prior to working. Any employee showing symptoms or with a fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher shall not be allowed to enter the establishment. All employees wear face masks. All visitors are strongly encouraged to wear (4) face masks. Contactless check-in is available. Markings are on the ground to denote proper (5) social distancing of at least 6 feet in the check-in area. Sanitation spray bottles with disinfectant or disinfectant wipes that are (6) EPA-approved for SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) are available throughout the establishment. Hand sanitizer stations are available throughout the establishment. All hand (7) sanitizer is comprised of at least sixty percent (60%) alcohol. (8) Employees conduct frequent routine cleanings of high-touch equipment and high-use areas while the establishment is open and conduct a deep clean of the entire establishment after the close of business every day. For establishments that are open 24 hours a day, a deep clean of the entire establishment must occur at least once every 24 hours. Disinfectants that are EPA-approved for SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) are used for all cleanings. (9)The following practices must be maintained: Equipment is used in a manner to ensure social distancing of at least 6 a. feet.

19	(5)	Equipment is used in a manner to ensure social distancing of at least 6 feet.

23		recommended by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and
24		the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.
