GOVERNOR ROY COOPER OBJECTIONS AND VETO MESSAGE:

House Bill 652, "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO HAS A CONCEALED CARRY HANDGUN PERMIT MAY CARRY A HANDGUN ON EDUCATIONAL PROPERTY THAT IS THE LOCATION OF BOTH A SCHOOL AND A PLACE OF RELIGIOUS WORSHIP AND TO ENACT THE 2ND AMENDMENT PROTECTION ACT OF 2020."

This bill allows guns on school property which threatens the safety of students and teachers.

Therefore, I veto the bill.

- b. The National Rifle Association.
- c. <u>A law enforcement agency, college, private or public institution or</u> <u>organization, or firearms training school, taught by instructors</u> <u>certified by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and</u> Training Standards Commission or the National Rifle Association.

Every instructor of an approved course shall file a copy of the course description, outline, and proof of certification annually, or upon modification of the course if more frequently, with the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission.

SECTION 4.(b) This part becomes effective December 1, 2020, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
