General Assembly Of North Carolina

Equipment Exemptions. – A fully autonomous vehicle that is designed to be operated 1 (c) 2 exclusively and at all times by an automated driving system shall not be subject to any State law or regulation requiring the installation, maintenance, or inspection of vehicle equipment that 3 4 relates to or supports motor vehicle operation by a human driver, but is not necessary for operation by an automated driving system alone. "Automated driving system" is defined in 5 G.S. 20-400." 6 7

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2021.
