2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE EASTERN NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL FOR THE
3	DEAF AND THE NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF ARE GOVERNED BY
4	BOARDS OF TRUSTEES AND FUNCTION SIMILARLY AS LOCAL SCHOOL
5	ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. Article 9C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:
8	"Article 9C.
9	"Schools for Students with Visual and Hearing Impairments.
10	"§ 115C-150.11. State Board of Education as governing agency.agency over the Governor
11	Morehead School; general supervision over residential schools for students with
12	hearing impairments.
13	(a) The State Board of Education shall be the sole governing agency for the Governor
14	Morehead School for the Blind, the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf, and the North
15	Carolina School for the Deaf. Blind. The Superintendent of Public Instruction through the
16	Department of Public Instruction shall be responsible for the administration, including
17	appointment of staff, and oversight of a school governed by this Article.the Governor Morehead
18	School for the Blind.
19	(b) The State Board of Education shall have general supervision for the Eastern North
20	Carolina School for the Deaf and the North Carolina School for the Deaf. Except as otherwise
21 22	provided for in this Article, the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf and the North Carolina School for the Deaf shall be housed administratively within the Department of Public
22	
23 24	Instruction, but shall operate independently through a board of trustees as the governing body for each residential school established under G.S. 115C-150.11A. Each board of trustees shall
24 25	appoint a director for the school, who shall act as secretary to the board of trustees in accordance
26	with G.S. 115C-150.11A and shall manage school personnel, day-to-day operations of the
20	school, and the school's operating budget at the direction of the board of trustees.
28	"§ 115C-150.11A. Board of trustees for each residential school for students with hearing
29	impairments.
30	(a) Appointment. – The Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf and the North
31	Carolina School for the Deaf shall be governed by a board of trustees established for each
32	residential school. There shall be five voting members for each board of trustees to be appointed
33	as follows:
34	(1) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
35	(2) <u>Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.</u>
36	(3) One member appointed by the Governor.



General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2021 Ex Officio, Nonvoting Members. - The President of the Eastern North Carolina 1 (b) 2 School for the Deaf Alumni Association or the President's designee shall be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf Board of Trustees. The 3 4 President of the North Carolina School for the Deaf Alumni Association or the President's 5 designee shall be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the North Carolina School for the Deaf 6 Board of Trustees. 7 Terms of Members. - The initial terms of a board of trustees for one of the members (c) 8 appointed pursuant to subdivisions (1) and (2) of subsection (a) of this section and for the member 9 appointed pursuant to subdivision (3) of subsection (a) of this section shall be for three-year 10 terms. Upon the expiration of those initial terms and every six years thereafter, successors shall be appointed for six-year terms. All other members appointed pursuant to subsection (a) of this 11 section shall be appointed for six-year terms. Terms shall commence July 1. Members shall serve 12 until their successors are appointed and qualified. All vacancies shall be filled by the appointing 13 14 authority for the vacating member for the remainder of the unexpired term. Chair; Director. – The director shall call the initial meeting of the board of trustees. 15 (d) The board of trustees shall elect one of its members as chair for a two-year term. The director 16 appointed in accordance with G.S. 115C-150.11(b) shall be ex officio secretary of the board of 17 18 trustees. The director shall recommend school personnel to the board of trustees to be employed 19 by the board. 20 (e) Meetings. – A board of trustees shall meet at least four times a year and also at such 21 other times as it may deem necessary. All meetings shall be subject to Article 33C of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes. The members shall receive per diem compensation and necessary 22 travel and subsistence expenses while engaged in the discharge of their official duties as is 23 24 provided by law for members of State boards and commissions. 25 Procedures. – A board of trustees shall determine its own rules of procedure and may (f) 26 delegate to committees that it creates any powers it deems appropriate. 27 "§ 115C-150.11B. Board of trustees for the residential schools for students with hearing 28 impairments; corporate powers. 29 The board of trustees of a residential school established pursuant to (a) 30 G.S. 115C-150.11A shall be known and distinguished by the name of "The_ Board 31 of Trustees" and shall continue as a body politic and corporate and by that name shall have 32 perpetual succession and a common seal. It shall be able and capable in law to take, demand, 33 receive, and possess all moneys, goods, and chattels that shall be given for the use of the 34 residential school, and to apply to same according to the will of the donors, and by gift, purchase, 35 or devise to receive, possess, enjoy, and retain forever any and all real and personal estate and 36 funds, of whatsoever kind, nature, or quality the same may be, in special trust and confidence 37 that the same, or the profits thereof, shall be applied to and for the use and purpose of establishing and endowing the residential school, and shall have power to receive donations from any source 38 39 whatsoever, to be devoted exclusively to the purposes of the maintenance of the residential 40 school, or according to the terms of the donation. A board of trustees shall be able and capable in law to bargain, sell, grant, alien, or 41 (b) 42 dispose of and convey and assure to the purchasers any and all such real and personal estate and 43 funds as it may lawfully acquire when the condition of the grant to it or the will of the devisor does not forbid it, and shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued in all courts whatsoever, 44 45 and shall have power to open and receive subscriptions, and in general may do all such things as 46 are usually done by bodies corporate and politic, or such as may be necessary for the promotion 47 of learning and virtue. 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Annual Report to Residential Schools. - Local superintendents shall report by 1 (b) 2 November 30 each year the names and addresses of parents, guardians, or custodians of any 3 hearing impaired or visually impaired children who have given written consent to the directors 4 of the Governor Morehead School for the Blind, the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf, 5 and the North Carolina School for the Deaf. The report shall include the type of disability of each 6 child, including whether the hearing and visual impairments range from partial to total disability, 7 and if the child has multiple disabilities with the visual or hearing impairment not identified as 8 the primary disability of the student. The report shall also be made to the Department of Public 9 Instruction.

10 (c) Confidentiality of Records. – The directors of the Governor Morehead School for the 11 Blind, the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf, and the North Carolina School for the 12 Deaf shall treat any information reported to the schools by a local superintendent under 13 subsection (b) of this section as confidential, except that a director or the director's designee may 14 contact the parents, guardians, or custodians of any hearing impaired or visually impaired 15 children whose information was included in the report. The information shall not be considered 16 a public record under G.S. 132-1."

17 18 SECTION 2. Section 10 of S.L. 2013-247 is repealed.

SECTION 3.(a) Section 8.15(b) of S.L. 2013-360 reads as rewritten:

19 "SECTION 8.15.(b) Notwithstanding G.S. 146-30 or any other provision of law, the 20 Department of Public Instruction shall <u>only</u> retain <u>all</u>-proceeds generated from the rental of 21 building space on the residential school campuses. <u>campus</u> of the Governor Morehead School for 22 <u>the Blind.</u> The Department of Public Instruction shall use all receipts generated from <u>these-the</u> 23 leases to staff and operate the <u>North Carolina School for the Deaf</u>, the Eastern North Carolina 24 <u>School for the Deaf</u>, and the Governor Morehead School. These receipts shall not be used to 25 support administrative functions within the Department."

26 **SECTION 3.(b)** Notwithstanding G.S. 146-30 or any other provision of law, 27 beginning with the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the Department of Public Instruction shall retain all 28 proceeds generated from the rental of building space on the residential school campuses of the 29 North Carolina School for the Deaf and the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf to be 30 used in accordance with this subsection. The Department of Public Instruction shall allocate all 31 receipts generated from these leases to each board of trustees in the amount generated from the 32 individual school to supplement funds to staff and operate that school. These receipts shall not 33 be used to support administrative functions within the Department of Public Instruction.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Article 9C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, as amended by this act, the Department of Public Instruction may continue its administrative duties and responsibilities for the North Carolina School for the Deaf and the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf subject to Article 9C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes as of June 30, 2022, until the board of trustees for each school has successfully transitioned into the administrative role required by this act, but in no event later than October 1, 2022.

40 **SECTION 5.** By May 1, 2022, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker 41 of the House of Representatives, and the Governor shall appoint the initial members of the boards 42 of trustees for the North Carolina School for the Deaf and the Eastern North Carolina School for 43 the Deaf to take office effective July 1, 2022, pursuant to G.S. 115C-150.11A.

SECTION 6. The Department of Public Instruction shall, in collaboration with the 44 45 personnel from the North Carolina School for the Deaf and the Eastern North Carolina School 46 for the Deaf develop a transition plan for the change in administration of the residential schools 47 for students with hearing impairments in accordance with the requirements of this act to be 48 effective July 1, 2022. By December 15, 2021, the Department of Public Instruction shall report 49 to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on the plan for transition in 50 administration of the residential schools, including any legislative recommendations necessary 51 to effectuate the transition.

SECTION 7. Sections 1 through 4 of this act become effective July 1, 2022. The
remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
