33	any weapon, including a starter gun, which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to		

expel a projectile by the action of an explosive, or its frame or receiver, or (ii) any firearm muffler or firearm silencer. This section does not apply to an antique firearm, as defined in G.S. 14-409.11.

   <u>Violation of this section is not a lesser included offense of G.S. 14-415.1A.</u>"
- 3 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses 4 committed on or after that date.
