5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.(a)** Chapter 89C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 7 section to read:

4 **SECTION 2.(b)** This section becomes effective October 1, 2023, and applies to applications on or after that date.

6 **SECTION 3.** The North Carolina State Board of Examiners for Engineers and 7 Surveyors shall adopt temporary rules to implement the provisions of this act.

8 **SECTION 4.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes 9 law.
