It is unlawful for any person or persons to receive from any postmaster, postal clerk,
employee in the parcel post department, rural mail carrier, express agent or employee, railroad
agent or employee within the State of North Carolina any pistol, assault weapon, or long gun
without having in his or their possession and without exhibiting at the time of the delivery of the
same and to the person delivering the same the permit from the sheriff as provided in
G.S. 14-409.51. Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a Class 2
misdemeanor.
