4	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-137.1 reads as rewritten:					
5	"§ 20-137.1. Child restraint systems required.					
6	(a) Every driver who is transporting one or more passengers of less than 16 years of age					
7	shall have all such passengers properly secured in a child passenger restraint system or seat belt					
8	which meets federal standards applicable at the time of its manufacture. For purposes of this					
9	section, a "child passenger restraint system" means any device designed to restrain or position a					
10	child in a motor vehicle, including a booster seat.					
11	(a1) A child less than eight years of age and less than <del>80 pounds in weight <u>57</u> inches in</del>					
12	height shall be properly secured in a weight appropriate height and weight appropriate child					
13	passenger restraint system. In vehicles equipped with an active passenger side front air bag, if					
14	the vehicle has	a rear seat, a child less than five years of age and less than 40 p	ounds in weight			
15	shall be properly secured in a rear seat, unless the child restraint system is designed for use with					
16	air bags. If no seating position equipped with a lap and shoulder belt to properly secure the					
17	weight-approp	riate child passenger restraint system is available, a child less that	in eight years of			
18	age and between 40 and 80 pounds may be restrained by a properly fitted lap belt only system as					
19	follows:

10			the midpoint of the child's shoulder and the center of the child's chest.		
11		<u>c.</u>	The child can sit with the child's back straight against the vehicle's seat		
12			back cushion and with the child's knees bent over the vehicle's seat		
13			edge without slouching.

15	SECT	ION 2.	This act becomes effective December 1, 2025, and applies to offenses		
16	committed on or after that date.
