2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE TEAM-BASED CARE COORDINATION IN MEDICAID
3	SUBSTANCE USE TREATMENT AND TO MODIFY THE MEDICAID PROGRAM TO
4	SUSPEND RATHER THAN TERMINATE MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY FOR
5	INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1.(a) The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health
8	Benefits (DHB), is directed, in coordination with a working group of stakeholders established by
9	DHB, to develop a team-based care coordination Medicaid service that includes, at a minimum,
10	screening for alcohol use disorder, opioid use disorder, and other mild to moderate substance use
11	disorders; prescription medications for opioid use disorder and alcohol use disorder; recovery
12	support; and case management.
13	SECTION 1.(b) No later than October 1, 2025, the Department of Health and Human
14	Services, Division of Health Benefits, shall submit a report to the Joint Legislative Oversight
15	Committee on Medicaid and the Fiscal Research Division containing details on the new Medicaid
16	service developed in accordance with this section. The report shall include all of the following:
17	(1) The State share of the cost of the service.
18	(2) The intended start date for the coverage of the service.
19	(3) The types of PHP capitated contracts that will cover the service and any
20	related proposed statutory changes to Article 4 of Chapter 108D of the General
21	Statutes.
22	SECTION 1.(c) The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health
23	Benefits, is directed to develop a statewide campaign to (i) educate healthcare providers and
24	community leaders about any changes made to the Medicaid program related to the treatment of
25	alcohol use disorder, opioid use disorder, and other mild to moderate substance use disorders, (ii)
26	train interested providers in clinical care for alcohol use disorder, opioid use disorder, and other
27	mild to moderate substance use disorders, and (iii) encourage substance use disorder provider
28	participation in the Medicaid program.
29	SECTION 2. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of
30	Health Benefits, shall continue to implement its policy changes to suspend, rather than terminate,
31	Medicaid benefits upon a Medicaid beneficiary's incarceration, as required by the federal
32	Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024, P.L. 118-42. No later than October 1, 2025, DHHS shall
33	submit to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Medicaid and the Fiscal Research
34	Division a report on (i) DHHS's progress implementing the automated process in the NCFAST
35	eligibility information system that allows data sharing between county jails and DHHS and (ii)

- 1 any ongoing challenges to meeting the federal requirement to suspend, rather than terminate,
- 2 Medicaid benefits upon a Medicaid beneficiary's incarceration.
- 3 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
