5	TO ENSURE THAT STATE-FUNDED BENEFITS PROVIDED BY OR THROUGH			
6	THESE STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES ARE AVAILABLE ONLY TO UNITED			
7	STATES CITIZENS AND NONCITIZENS RESIDING IN THE UNITED STATES WITH			
8	LEGAL PERMISSION; DIRECTING STATE-FUNDED INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER			
9	EDUCATION TO ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT A POLICY TO VERIFY THAT ALL			
10	APPLICANTS ARE LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO RESIDE IN THE UNITED STATES;			
11	AND DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, DIVISION OF			
12	EMPLOYMENT SECURITY, TO ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT A POLICY TO VERIFY

17	PART I. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES			
18	SECTION 1. To the extent permitted by federal law, the Department of Health and			
19	Human Services (DHHS) shall take all steps necessary to cease providing State-funded benefits			
20	to noncitizens residing in the United States without legal permission.			
21	SECTION 2. To the extent permitted by federal law, the DHHS shall develop and			
22	implement a plan to review and update the eligibility criteria for all State-funded benefits to			
23	ensure that noncitizens determined to be residing in the United States without legal permission			
24	are ineligible to receive State-funded benefits. As a part of this plan, the DHHS shall develop a			
25	method for verifying the immigration status of applicants for State-funded benefits who are			
26	noncitizens prior to the initiation of benefits.			
27	SECTION 3. By January 15, 2026, the DHHS shall report to the Joint Legislative			
28	Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services and the Fiscal Research Division all of the			
29	following:			
30	(1) The steps taken to implement Section 1 of this act and the resulting success of			
31	those steps.			
32	(2) A list of State-funded benefits for which the DHHS is prohibited from			
33	changing.			
34	(3) The plan developed and implemented pursuant to Section 2 of this act, which			
35	shall include a citation to each federal law or regulation that prohibits the

21	a policy, to the extent allowed by federal law, to verify that all applicants for enrollment are				
22	legally authorized to reside in the United States for determining eligibility for in-State tuition and				
23	financial aid.

25		YMENT COMPENSATION			
26		SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any provision of State law and to the extent			
27	permitted by federal law, by January 15, 2026, the Department of Commerce, Division of				
28	Employment Security, shall adopt and implement a policy to verify, for unemployment benefits				
29	purposes, that all applicants are legally authorized to reside in the United States prior to the first				
30	payment of benefits.
