A pro rata portion of the established regular tuition rate charged a full-time student shall be charged a part-time student taking any curriculum course. 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SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, there shall be no impediment to the use of the Voice Interoperability Plan for Emergency Responders (VIPER) system by hospital police agencies certified by the Attorney General pursuant to Chapter 74E of the General Statutes, so long as those agencies choose to acquire the necessary equipment and utilize the VIPER system.
