2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE STUDY COMMITTEE ON ASSISTANT DISTRICT			
3	ATTORNEY, ASSISTANT PUBLIC DEFENDER, AND PRIVATE ASSIGNED			
4	COUNSEL PAY RATES.			
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	SECTION 1. Committee Established. – There is established the Study Committee			
7	on Assistant District Attorney, Assistant Public Defender, and Private Assigned Counsel Pay			
8	Rates (Committee). The Committee shall include 12 voting members, as follows:			
9	(1) Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of			
10	the House of Representatives.			
11	(2) Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the			
12	Senate.			
13	(3) The Executive Director of the Conference of District Attorneys or the			
14	Executive Director's designee.			
15	(4) One member appointed by the Conference of District Attorneys.			
16	(5) The Executive Director of Indigent Defense Services or the Executive			
17	Director's designee.			
18	(6) One member appointed by the Office of Indigent Defense Services.			
19	(7) Two members of the State Bar that practice criminal law, appointed by the			
20	North Carolina Bar Association.			
21	(8) Two members of the State Bar that practice criminal law, appointed by the			
22	Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.			
23	SECTION 2. Cochairs. – The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker			
24	of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair from their appointees.			
25	SECTION 3. Vacancies. – A vacancy on the Committee shall be filled by the original			
26	appointing authority using the criteria for the prior appointment.			
27	SECTION 4. Duties. – The Committee shall serve as a study and advisory committee			
28	on the pay rates of assistant district attorneys, assistant public defenders, and private assigned			
29	counsel. Pursuant to this work, the Committee shall study, at a minimum, each of the following			
30	(1) The current state of assistant district attorney, assistant public defender, and			
31	private assigned counsel pay throughout the State, in general, and when			
32	separated into the three cost-of-living categories of urban, suburban, and rural			
33	(2) The current pay structure for assistant district attorneys, assistant public			
34	defenders, and private assigned counsel.
