The Department of Insurance shall identify any pharmacy deserts. (a)

The Department of Insurance shall publish on its website and report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services a list of pharmacy deserts identified under subsection (a) of this section. The initial publication and report shall be made no later than January 1, 2026. Updated publications and reports shall be made every four years thereafter, except that an updated publication and report shall be made no later than 12 months after the release of decennial federal census data."";

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and on page 9, lines 7-12, by deleting the lines;

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and on page 9, lines 15-22, by rewriting the lines to read:

No pharmacy benefits manager contract may require, either, directly or indirectly or through a pharmacy services administration organization, an independent pharmacy or any pharmacy in a pharmacy desert, to accept reimbursement for providing a covered prescription drug, device, or service at a rate less than the acquisition cost for the covered drug, device, or service. A violation of this section is an unfair trade practice under Article 63 of this Chapter and under G.S. 75-1.1 and is subject to all of the enforcement and penalty provisions of an unfair trade practice under this Chapter and under Article 1 of Chapter 75 of the General Statutes.";

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21	SECTION 5.1.(d) Article 4A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by			
22	adding a new section to read:			
23	"§ 90-85.21E. Independent pharmacy and pharmacy desert prescriptions.			
24	(a) An independent pharmacy or a pharmacist in a pharmacy desert may decline to fill or			
25	refill a prescription if (i) that act would directly result in an unbearable cost to the independent			
26	pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert or (ii) the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in			
27	a pharmacy desert will be or is paid less than the acquisition cost for the covered drug, device, or			
28	service, provided that the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert meets the			
29	requirements of subsection (b) of this section. If the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a			
30	pharmacy desert cannot find a pharmacy to accept the referral without causing harm to the			
31	patient, then the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert must fill the			
32	prescription. An independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert declining to fill a			
33	prescription under this section shall not be a violation of any provision of G.S. 90-85.40.			
34	(b) If the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert elects to decline to			
35	fill or refill a prescription under subsection (a) of this section, then, prior to declining to fill or			
36	refill a prescription, the independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert shall refer the			
37	prescription and patient to another pharmacy that is equally convenient for the patient to fill or			
38	refill the prescription in the same manner without the patient suffering any harm. The			
39	independent pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert may refer the prescription to a			
40	pharmacy that only provides centralized pharmacy services in this State through the mail or			
41	remote medication order processing services subject to the Board's rules if the independent			

pharmacy or pharmacist in a pharmacy desert makes a determination the provision of pharmaceutical services through the mail does not harm the patient."";
