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Amends Title [NO] ,2025 Fifth Edition Representative Hawkins moves to amend the bill on page 277, lines 6-7, by inserting between those lines, a new section to read: "ESTABLISH NC COMMISSION ON YOUTH MENTORING **SECTION 9J.11.** Article 9 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Part to read: "Part 21A. North Carolina Commission on Youth Mentoring. "§ 143B-208.20. North Carolina Commission on Youth Mentoring – members; selection; quorum; compensation. Creation and Duties. – There is established the North Carolina Commission on Youth (a) Mentoring of the Department of Health and Human Services. The Commission shall have the following powers and duties: Establish a grant program for small- to medium-sized youth nonprofit (1) mentoring organizations located in North Carolina with the intended goals of (i) invest in the awareness and sustainment of current and new community youth mentoring programs, (ii) increase high quality mentoring that supports youth long-term goals and reduce safety- risk behaviors, and (iii) support a positive parent, adult, and youth connected community through efficiently trained and equipped mentor programming. Develop an application process for the program and inform mentoring (2) organizations how to apply. Provide an annual report on or before December 1 on the distributions of the (3) grants to the chairs of the House Appropriations Committee on General Government, the chairs of the Senate Appropriations Committee on General Government and Information Technology, and the Fiscal Research Division. The report shall include the following: The number of organizations that applied for grants. The amount of grant funds awarded and the names of the recipients. b. The balance of funds remaining. <u>c.</u> Findings of social impact.
