OVERVIEW: The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for Senate Bill 328 would prohibit hempderived consumables from being possessed by or sold to any person under age 21.

CURRENT LAW and BILL ANALYSIS:

The PCS for S328 would prohibit the possession of hemp-derived consumable products for persons under the age of 21. It would also prohibit any person to knowingly sell or deliver a hemp-derived consumable product to a person who is under the age of 21. Any person who violates these provisions would be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

A "hemp-derived consumable product" would be defined as follows:

A hemp product that is a finished good intended for human ingestion or inhalation that contains a concentration of any hemp-derived cannabinoid. This term does not include hemp products intended for topical application or seeds or seed-derived ingredients that are generally recognized as safe by the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective October 1, 2025, and apply to offenses committed on or after that date.
