10		<u>(1)</u>	<u>Deliver.</u> – The actual constructive, or attempted transfer from one person to					
11			another of a controlled substance, whether or not there is an agency					
12		(2)	relationship.					
13		<u>(2)</u>	Hemp. – As defined in G.S. 90-87.					
14		<u>(3)</u>	Hemp-derived cannabinoid. – Any phytocannabinoid found in hemp,					
15			including delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol (delta-9 THC), tetrahydrocannabinolic					
16 17			acid (THCA), cannabidiol (CBD), cannabidiolic acid (CBDA), cannabinol (CBN), cannabigerol (CBG), cannabichromene (CBC), cannabicyclol (CBL),					
18			cannabivarin (CBV), tetrahydrocannabivarin (THCV), cannabidivarin					
19			(CBDV), cannabicitran (CBT), delta-7 tetrahydrocannabinol (delta-7 THC),					
20			delta-8 tetrahydrocannibinol (delta-8 THC), or delta-10 tetrahydrocannibinol					
21			(delta-10 THC). This term also includes any synthetic cannabinoid derived					
22			from hemp and contained in a hemp-derived consumable product.					
23		<u>(4)</u>	Hemp-derived consumable product. – A hemp product that is a finished good					
24			intended for human ingestion or inhalation that contains a concentration of					
25			any hemp-derived cannabinoid, including any hemp product that at the time					
26			of sale to the ultimate consumer contains a delta-9 THC concentration of not					
27			more than three-tenths of one percent (0.3%) on a dry weight basis. This term					
28			does not include hemp products intended for topical application, or seeds or					
29			seed-derived ingredients that are generally recognized as safe by the United					
30			States Food and Drug Administration (FDA).					
31		<u>(5)</u>	Hemp product. – As defined in G.S. 90-87.					
32		<u>(6)</u>	<u>Ingestion.</u> – The process of consuming through the mouth, by swallowing into					
33		,·	the gastrointestinal system or through tissue absorption.					
34		<u>(7)</u>	<u>Inhalation. – The process of consuming into the respiratory system through</u>					
35			the mouth or nasal passages.

6			prospective purchaser is under 21 years of age.

9	<u>(c)</u>	Punis	shment. – Any person who violates this section is	guilty of a Class 2		
10	misdeme	anor."
