SUMMARY: House Bill 30 would provide that the name and address of a lottery prize winner are confidential except in certain circumstances.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 30 would amend G.S. 18C-132 to provide that the name and address of a winner of a lottery game are to remain confidential except:

- When the winner consents to the release of information;
- To the extent necessary to notify the North Carolina Department of Revenue under G.S. 18C-132(l);
- To notify the IRS;
- To notify the tax authorities in the state in which the prize winner resides;
- To comply with requirements of the debt set-off program; or
- To comply with statutes governing supplemental proceedings against a judgment debtor.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act becomes effective July 1, 2015.
