SUMMARY: The Proposed Committee Substitute for House Bill 467 would provide that the elected Coroner of Cleveland County shall appoint medical examiners. It would also authorize the Coroner to appoint individuals, other than specified medical professionals, that he or she deems qualified.

[As introduced, this bill was identical to S266, as introduced by Sen. Daniel, which is currently in Senate Re-ref to Health Care. If fav, re-ref to Judiciary I.]

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CURRENT LAW: Under G.S. 130A-382, the Chief Medical Examiner has authority to appoint one or more county medical examiners in each county for three year terms. In appointing medical examiners, the Chief Medical Examiner is required to give preference to physicians licensed to practice medicine in this State but may also appoint licensed physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, coroners, or emergency medical technician paramedics.

BILL ANALYSIS: The PCS for House Bill 467 would authorize the Coroner in Cleveland County, rather than the Chief Medical Examiner, to appoint medical examiners in Cleveland County. It would also allow appointment of individuals, other than listed medical professionals, that the Coroner deems qualified. The Coroner would still be required to give preference to physicians licensed to practice medicine.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The act would be effective when it becomes law.
