SUMMARY: *House Bill 54 authorizes the Chief Administrative Law Judge to appoint a Codifier of Rules to serve in the Office of Administrative Hearings.*

[As introduced, this bill was identical to S92, as introduced by Sen. Hartsell, which is currently in Senate Appropriations/Base Budget.]

BILL ANALYSIS:

House Bill 54 authorizes the Chief Administrative Law Judge to appoint a Codifier of Rules to serve in the Office of Administrative Hearings. The salary of the Codifier of Rules will be 90% of the salary of the Chief Administrative Law Judge. Instead of merit and other increment raises, the Codifier of Rules will receive longevity pay on the same basis as is provided to employees subject to the North Carolina Human Resources Act.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

House Bill 54 would become effective when it becomes law.

BACKGROUND:

This bill was recommended by the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee.
