

SENATE BILL 124: Modernize Assumed Business Name Statutes

SUMMARY: Senate Bill 124 would modernize the law governing the use of assumed business names, would appropriate funds for that purpose, and would make related conforming and technical amendments, as recommended by the General Statutes Commission.

CURRENT LAW: Currently, the statutory provisions governing engaging in business under an assumed name are codified in Article 14 of Chapter 66 of the General Statutes, "Business Under Assumed Name Regulated."

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 124 would repeal current Article 14 of Chapter 66 of the General Statutes, and codify the *"Assumed Business Name Act"* as G.S. 66-71.1 through G.S. 66-71.15, and make related conforming and technical amendments to other sections of the General Statutes.

The details of Senate Bill 124 are contained in the memorandum of the General Statutes Commission, attached to this summary.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Section 10 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2015. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 2016. This act does not affect a civil action or proceeding commenced or a right accrued before July 1, 2016.
