SUMMARY: *Senate Bill 391 would provide that an injunction prohibiting street gang activity that constitutes a public nuisance expires three years after entry of the order rather than one year.*

BILL ANALYSIS: G.S. 14-50.43 allows a nuisance action to be brought against any person participating in street gang activity and an injunction to be issued against that person prohibiting them from participating in street gang activity. Senate Bill 391 would provide that an injunction under that provision expires three years after entry of the order rather than one year.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act becomes effective December 1, 2015, and applies to orders entered by the court on or after that date.
