SUMMARY: The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for Senate Bill 89 would amend the law directing the clerk of court to transmit certain data relevant to the factors that disqualify a person from obtaining a permit to purchase or transfer a handgun.

BILL ANALYSIS:

Section 1 of the PCS for Senate Bill 89 would amend G.S. 14-404(c1) to clarify what information the clerk of court must transmit to the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS). This section also clarifies that the data is to only be transmitted if NICS requests that such data be transmitted and if the data can be transmitted in a format acceptable by NICS.

Section 2 of the PCS directs AOC, in consultation with the SBI, to work with NICS to determine the feasibility of reporting additional information from the State's court and law enforcement records. AOC and the SBI shall report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety on or before March 1, 2016.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.
