SUMMARY: Senate Bill 890 amends the Charter of the Town of Marietta in Robeson County, to authorize the Town to hold municipal elections every four years.

CURRENT LAW: Under current law, the Town of Marietta has a four member council with four year, staggered terms, and and a mayor with a two year term.

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 890 amends the Charter of the Town of Marietta in Robeson County, to authorize the Town to hold municipal elections every four years, with the Council and Mayor all serving four years terms.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.
