

HOUSE BILL 208: Occup. Therapy/Choice of Provider.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 208 would amend G.S. 58-50-30 to allow insureds to receive insurance-covered occupational therapy from the licensed occupational therapist of their choice.

[As introduced, this bill was identical to S307, as introduced by Sens. Newton, Krawiec, which is currently in the Senate Committee on Commerce and Insurance.]

CURRENT LAW: G.S. 58-50-30 requires insurers to pay for services rendered by certain, defined health care providers chosen by the insured, regardless of any limitations in the insurance contract between the parties.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 208 would add licensed occupational therapists to the list of providers in G.S. 58-50-30(b). This change would allow insureds to see the occupational therapist of their choice and still have their insurers provide coverage.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This bill would become effective October 1, 2017, and apply to health benefits contracts issued, renewed, or amended on or after that date.
