OVERVIEW: House Bill 360 would provide greater flexibility to Harnett County Schools in scheduling exams for semester courses.

CURRENT LAW: Under G.S. 115C-174.12(a)(4), annual assessments of student achievement and final exams for semester courses must be administered within the final <u>five</u> instructional days of the semester. However, exceptions can be made for: (1) students with individualized education programs; (2) students with 504 plans; or (3) students taking courses with national or international curricula required to be held at designated times.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 360 would allow Harnett County Schools to administer annual assessments of student achievement and final exams for semester courses within the final <u>seven</u> instructional days of the semester. The exceptions described above would still apply.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would be effective when it becomes law.
