**OVERVIEW:** *S.L. 2018-69 does the following:*

- *Directs State entities to compile and submit a list of crimes adopted by the entity to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight Committee (APO) and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety (JPS).*
- *Directs the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to compile a list of all crimes at common law and in the General Statutes that are deemed unnecessary and submit the list to APO and JPS.*
- *Directs counties, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts to submit a list of all ordinances punishable as a misdemeanor to APO and JPS.*

*The act became effective on June 25, 2018.*

**BILL ANALYSIS:**

The act directs all state agencies, boards, and commissions with rulemaking power to compile and submit a list of the crimes adopted or pending implementation by the entity to APO and JPS by December 1, 2018.

The act also directs the AOC to:

- Compile a list of all crimes defined at common law and in the General Statutes.
- Identify unnecessary crimes pursuant to factors listed in Section 2.
- Submit a list of unnecessary crimes to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by February 1, 2019.

The act further directs counties, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts to submit a list of all ordinances that are punishable as a misdemeanor to APO and JPS by December 1, 2018.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** The act became effective on June 25, 2018.
