OVERVIEW: The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) to House Bill 379 would require certain state entities to compile and submit a list of crimes covered by the entity to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight Committee (APO Oversight) and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety (JPS Oversight).

BILL ANALYSIS:

Analysis of:

Section 1 of PCS would require all state agencies, boards, and commissions with rulemaking power to submit a list of the crimes covered or pending implementation by the entity to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by December 1, 2018.

Section 2 of the PCS would authorize the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to:

- Compile a list of all crimes defined at common law and in the General Statutes.
- Identify unnecessary crimes pursuant to factors listed in this section.
- Submit a list of unnecessary crimes to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by February 1, 2019.

Section 3 of the PCS would require counties, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts to submit a list of all misdemeanor ordinances to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by December 1, 2018.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This bill would be effective when it becomes law.
