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**OVERVIEW:** *The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) to House Bill 379 would require certain state entities to compile and submit a list of crimes covered by the entity to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight Committee (APO Oversight) and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety (JPS Oversight).*

### BILL ANALYSIS:

**Section 1** of PCS would require all state agencies, boards, and commissions with rulemaking power to submit a list of the crimes covered or pending implementation by the entity to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by December 1, 2018.

**Section 2** of the PCS would authorize the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to:

- Compile a list of all crimes defined at common law and in the General Statutes.
- Identify unnecessary crimes pursuant to factors listed in this section.
- Submit a list of unnecessary crimes to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by February 1, 2019.

**Section 3** of the PCS would require counties, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts to submit a list of all misdemeanor ordinances to APO Oversight and JPS Oversight by December 1, 2018.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill would be effective when it becomes law.

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
