

## **HOUSE BILL 826: Modify Low-Performing School Definition.**

OVERVIEW: House Bill 826 would modify the definition of low-performing schools.

**CURRENT LAW:** G.S. 115C-105-37 states that low-performing schools are "those that receive a school performance grade of D or F and a school growth score of "met expected growth" or "not met expected growth".

**BILL ANALYSIS:** The bill would modify the definition of low-performing schools to be those schools that receive a school performance grade of D or F and a school growth score of "not met expected growth".

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** The bill would become effective when it becomes law and apply with the 2017-2018 school year.
