OVERVIEW: Section 34.18 of S.L. 2017-57 extends the moratorium enacted in 2016 on adoption of new maps under the Transportation Corridor Official Map Act until July 1, 2018.

This section became effective July 1, 2017.

CURRENT LAW: The Transportation Corridor Official Map Act was enacted in 1987, and it authorized the Department of Transportation and other governing bodies to adopt and file transportation corridor maps, which place restrictions on property located within a corridor.

In 2016, the General Assembly enacted a one-year moratorium on adoption of new maps under the Map Act from July 1, 2016, to July 1, 2017. (S.L. 2016-90)

BILL ANALYSIS: This section extends the moratorium on adoption of new maps under the Map Act for one additional year, providing that it ends on July 1, 2018, rather than July 1, 2017.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective July 1, 2017.
