

SENATE BILL 448: Professors in the Classroom.

OVERVIEW: S.L. 2017-91 authorizes local boards of education to contract with higher education faculty members to serve as adjunct instructors for core academic subjects without having to obtain a teaching license.

This act became effective June 30, 2017.

PRIOR LAW: Teachers employed in public schools in the State are required by G.S. 115C-295 to hold a teaching license. G.S. 115C-157.1 exempts certain career and technical education teachers from the licensure requirement.

BILL ANALYSIS: This act authorizes local boards of education to contract with higher education faculty members to serve as adjunct instructors for core academic subjects in grades kindergarten through 12 without the faculty members having to obtain a teaching license. The State Board of Education must establish minimum criteria for such adjunct instructors. These adjunct instructors have to:

- Be employed less than 20 hours per week or less than six full consecutive months. As temporary employees, they would not be eligible to earn paid leave, participate in the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System, or receive or purchase health benefits through the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees.
- Pass a criminal history check.
- Receive preservice training in:
 - \circ The identification and education of children with disabilities.
 - Positive management of student behavior.
 - Effective communication for defusing and de-escalating disruptive or dangerous behavior.
 - Safe and appropriate use of seclusion and restraint.
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EFFECTIVE DATE: This act became effective June 30, 2017.
