



SENATE BILL 99: Appropriations Act of 2018, Sec. 34.9: Extend Map Act Moratorium

OVERVIEW: *Sec. 34.9 of S.L. 2018-5 extends the moratorium on transportation corridor official map adoptions until July 1, 2019.*

This section became effective July 1, 2018.

CURRENT LAW: The Map Act, also known as the Transportation Corridor Official Map Act, was enacted in 1987, and it authorized the Department of Transportation and other governing bodies to adopt and file transportation corridor maps, which place restrictions on property located within a transportation corridor.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 34.9 extends the moratorium on transportation corridor official map adoptions until July 1, 2019. It also requires that the North Carolina Department of Transportation submit reports every 60 days to the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee of all claims and causes of action seeking compensation for damages arising from transportation corridor maps.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective July 1, 2018.

BACKGROUND: Section 17 of S.L. 2016-90 rescinded all of the existing corridor maps filed under the Map Act and put a moratorium on filing maps until 2017. The moratorium was extended by Section 34.18 of S.L. 2017-57 to 2018 prior to the extension in this current Session Law.
