



# SENATE BILL 99: Appropriations Act of 2018, Sec. 18B.6: Allocation of Assistant District Attorneys

**OVERVIEW:** *Sec. 18B.6 of S.L. 2018-5 changes the number of full-time assistant district attorneys for certain counties as follows:*

- *Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren Counties now have 14, not 13, assistant district attorneys.*
- *Caswell and Rockingham Counties now have 9, not 10, assistant district attorneys.*

*This act was vetoed by the Governor on June 6, 2018, and that veto was overridden by the General Assembly on June 12, 2018. This section became effective on July 1, 2018.*

**BILL ANALYSIS:** Sec. 18B.6 of S.L. 2018-5 increases the number of full-time assistant district attorneys in Prosecutorial District 10, which is comprised of Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren Counties, from 13 to 14. It decreases the number of full-time assistant district attorneys in Prosecutorial District 22, which is comprised of Caswell and Rockingham Counties, from 10 to 9.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This section became effective on July 1, 2018.
