

HOUSE BILL 1043: 2020 COVID-19 Recovery Act, Sec. 3.3(39): Rural Hospitals Relief Fund

OVERVIEW: Section 3.3(39) of S.L. 2020-4 allocates \$65 million to establish the COVID-19 Rural Hospitals Relief Fund. This section became effective May 4, 2020.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 3.3(39) of S.L. 2020-4 allocates \$65 million to establish the COVID-19 Rural Hospitals Relief Fund. The funds will be allocated as grants to hospitals designated as critical access hospitals by CMS and to hospitals in Tier 1 or Tier 2 counties. The funds must be used to offset expenses incurred in providing patient care in response to the COVID-19 pandemic as follows:

- Up to 60% of lost revenues from foregone elective procedures during the emergency period, net of federal funds received from the CARES Act.
- Supplies and equipment purchased in accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines.
- Rapidly ramping up infection control and triage training for health care professionals.
- Retrofitting separate areas to screen and treat patients with suspected COVID-19 infections, including isolation areas in or around hospital emergency departments.
- Increasing the number of patient care beds to provide surge capacity.
- Transporting patients with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 safely to or from rural facilities.
- Planning, training, and implementing expanded telehealth capabilities.
- Procuring staff or consultants to help mitigate the burden of extensive review of new and incoming federal and State regulatory guidelines.
- Salary support for furloughed employees.

Critical access hospital grants must be at least \$350,000, and grants for hospitals in Tier 1 or 2 counties must be at least \$250,000. Each grant recipient must submit a detailed written report to the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services by December 1, 2020, that contains a breakdown of all expenditures from the funds received under this subdivision and any Federal legislation.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective May 4, 2020.

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
