OVERVIEW: House Bill 176 would appropriate \$1,500,000 for the 2019-2020 fiscal year to complete the development of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Park.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 176 would appropriate \$1,500,000 for the 2019-2020 fiscal year to the Fayetteville/Cumberland County Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Committee, a nonprofit organization, to complete the development of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Park in Fayetteville, North Carolina.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective July 1, 2019.

BACKGROUND: The Martin Luther King, Jr. Park was established in Fayetteville, North Carolina in 2007. The requested funds would be used to add a fountain, a lighted spire, a walking trail, gardens, and seating for handicapped and elderly persons in the park.
