

HOUSE BILL 18: Allow Absentee Ballots/Fire District Election.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 18 would allow absentee voting in fire district elections.

CURRENT LAW: Any qualified voter of the State may vote by absentee ballot in a statewide primary, general, or special election and any qualified voter of a county is authorized to vote by absentee ballot in any primary or election conducted by the county board of elections. G.S. 163A-1295.

Absentee voting includes the following:

- ➤ Ballots cast in-person at an early voting "one-stop" voting site run by a county board of elections, either at the county board's office or another site approved by the county board.
- ➤ Ballots cast absentee by mail under the absentee ballot statutes (Part 1 of Article 21 of Chapter 163A).
- ➤ Ballots cast under the military and overseas absentee ballot statutes (Part 2 of Article 21 of Chapter 163A).

Absentee ballots are currently not permitted in fire district elections. G.S. 163A-1295(c).

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 18 would authorize qualified voters to vote by absentee ballot in fire district elections.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Effective when it becomes law, and applies to fire district elections held on or after that date.
