

HOUSE BILL 18: Allow Absentee Ballots/Fire District Election.

OVERVIEW: S.L. 2019-136 allows absentee voting in fire district elections.

This act became effective July 19, 2019.

CURRENT LAW: Any qualified voter of the State may vote by absentee ballot in a statewide primary, general, or special election and any qualified voter of a county is authorized to vote by absentee ballot in any primary or election conducted by the county board of elections.

Absentee voting includes the following:

- Ballots cast in-person at an early voting "one-stop" voting site run by a county board of elections, either at the county board's office or another site approved by the county board.
- > Ballots cast absentee by mail under the absentee ballot statutes.
- > Ballots cast under the military and overseas absentee ballot statutes.

Absentee ballots are currently not permitted in fire district elections.

BILL ANALYSIS: This act authorizes qualified voters to vote by absentee ballot in fire district elections.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act became effective July 19, 2019, and applies to fire district elections held on or after that date.
