



HOUSE BILL 200: 2019 Storm Recovery Act.

OVERVIEW: *The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) to House Bill 200 provides State match funding for disaster relief from Hurricane Dorian and other named storms and also provides contingent funding for the Rural Health Care Stabilization Fund.*

BILL ANALYSIS: The PCS to House Bill 200 does the following:

- **Section 1.1** – Appropriates \$70,812,336 in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year from the General Fund to the Hurricane Florence Disaster Recovery Fund to be allocated to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to use as a State match for Hurricane Florence federal disaster assistance programs.
- **Section 1.2** – Appropriates (i) \$31,673,258 in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year from the General Fund to the State Emergency Response and Disaster Relief Fund to be allocated to DPS to use as a State match for federal disaster relief programs related to Hurricanes Matthew, Michael, and Dorian and (ii) \$30,000,000 to the Department of Transportation in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year from the General Fund to the Department of Transportation to be used for current and future activities related to recovery from Hurricane Dorian.
- **Section 1.3** – If Senate Bill 537, 2019 Regular Session, or substantially similar legislation enacted during the 2019 Regular Session establishing the Rural Health Care Stabilization Fund, becomes law, appropriates from the General Fund to the Office of State Budget and Management the sums of \$13,397,000 in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and \$6,603,000 in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to be used for the Rural Health Care Stabilization Fund. This section is repealed if House Bill 966, 2019 Regular Session, becomes law.
- **Sections 2.1 – 2.7** – Boilerplate language governing the use of disaster relief funds.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.
