OVERVIEW: House Bill 256 would adopt the Fried Chicken Festival, held on the third weekend of May of every year in the City of Fayetteville, as the official fried chicken festival of the State of North Carolina.

CURRENT LAW: State symbols and other official adoptions of the State are found in Chapter 145 of the General Statutes. Currently, North Carolina does not have an official fried chicken festival.

BILL ANALYSIS: This act would amend Chapter 145 of the General Statutes by adding a new section to establish the Fried Chicken Festival, held on the third weekend of May of every year in the City of Fayetteville, as the official fried chicken festival of the State of North Carolina.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective when it becomes law.
