



# HOUSE BILL 257: Motorcycles/Face Masks.

**OVERVIEW:** *House Bill 257 would amend G.S. 14-12.11 to allow a person to wear a mask while operating a motorcycle, and require the person to remove the mask during encounters with law enforcement.*

**CURRENT LAW:** State law prohibits a person from wearing a mask, hood, or other device, to conceal the identity of the wearer, upon any of the following:

- Lane, walkway, alleyway, street, road, highway, or public way in the State. **G.S. 14-12.7.**
- Public property of any municipality or county of the State, or of the State of North Carolina. **G.S. 14-12.8.**
- Premise, enclosure or house of another person. **G.S. 14-12.9.**
- Meeting or demonstration on private property, except by written permission of the owner or occupant. **G.S. 14-12.10.**
- While placing an exhibit at any place in the State for purpose of intimidating another person, preventing a lawful act, or causing an unlawful act. **G.S. 14-12.14.**

**Exceptions.** – A mask may be worn for the holiday season; employment purposes; theatrical productions; defense drills, exercises, or emergencies; or as part of a parade, ritual, initiation, ceremony, or celebration requirement of a society, order or organization. **G.S. 14-12.11.**

**BILL ANALYSIS:** House Bill 257 would allow a person to wear a mask for the purpose of protecting the person's head or face when operating a motorcycle, and require the person to remove the mask during traffic stops, checkpoints, roadblocks, or when approached by a law enforcement officer.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act is effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
