OVERVIEW: *House Bill 273 would add one additional member to the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission.*

[As introduced, this bill was identical to S185, as introduced by Sens. Sanderson, Krawiec, Johnson, which is currently in Senate Rules and Operations of the Senate.]

CURRENT LAW: Currently, the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission is comprised of 34 members, which includes police chiefs, police officers, various appointees from the North Carolina Department of Justice and North Carolina Department of Public Safety, members of the North Carolina General Assembly, and various other appointees as outlined within G.S. 17C-3.

BILL ANALYSIS:

House Bill 273 would add one At-large Group member to the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission, who would be a full-time sworn law-enforcement officer selected by the North Carolina Police Benevolent Association.

The initial term of the office would be July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2022, and subsequent appointees would be appointed for a term of 3 years, however the member appointed by the Police Benevolent Association shall serve at the will of the appointing authority.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
