OVERVIEW: House Bill 580 increases the foster care and adoption assistance payment rates and appropriates funds for that purpose.

[As introduced, this bill was identical to S636, as introduced by Sens. Hise, Krawiec, Harrington, which is currently in Senate Appropriations/Base Budget.]

CURRENT LAW: Article 2 of Chapter 108A of the General Statues governs programs of public assistance in the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services.

<u>G.S. 108A-49.1</u> provides the maximum rates for State participation in foster care and adoption assistance payment rates.

BILL ANALYSIS: This bill increases the foster care and adoption assistance payment rates and appropriates funds for that purpose.

<u>Section 1.(a)</u> increases the rates for foster care and adoption assistance per child per month, <u>effective July</u> 1, 2020, as follows:

<u>Section 1.(b)</u> increases the rates for foster care and adoption assistance per child per month, <u>effective July 1, 2021</u>, as follows:

Age 6-12	\$581.00	\$727.00
Age 13-21	\$634.00	\$761.00

<u>Section 3</u> appropriates from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services \$6,868,758.00 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to implement the rate increases in this bill.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Section 1.(a) of this bill becomes effective July 1, 2020 and Section 1.(b) of this bill becomes effective July 1, 2021. Section 2 of this bill becomes effective July 1, 2019.
