

## **HOUSE BILL 760:** Expand Loss Prevention Investigations.

## OVERVIEW: S.L. 2019-193 does the following:

- Expands the investigative authority of loss prevention workers by clarifying that those workers are not included in the definition of a private protective services profession.
- Clarifies that a prosecution for obtaining property by false pretenses is not barred because some acts constituting the crime did not occur within the State.

This act became effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.

## **BILL ANALYSIS:**

This act amends the definition of private protective services in G.S. 74C-3(b)(14) to clarify that loss prevention employees are not included in that definition.

This act amends G.S. 14-100 (Obtaining property by false pretenses) to clarify that a prosecutor is not required to establish that all of the act constituting the crime occurred within the jurisdiction of the State, and that it is not a defense if some part of the offense occurred outside of the jurisdiction of the State.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act became effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
