

HOUSE BILL 80: Roanoke Rapids Lake/Unattended Equip.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 80 would make it a Class 2 misdemeanor to leave unattended or unoccupied any equipment or vessels that may be used for the purpose of hunting waterfowl between two hours after sunset and 4:00 A.M. during waterfowl hunting season on Roanoke Rapids Lake in Halifax and Northampton Counties.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 1 of the bill would prohibit a person from leaving unattended or unoccupied any equipment or vessels that may be used for the purpose of taking migratory waterfowl, including, but not limited to, mobile or temporary blinds, layout boats, and decoys, prior to 4:00 A.M. each day during established waterfowl hunting seasons. All unattended equipment and unoccupied vessels must be removed by two hours after sunset each day unless they remain on a portion of the shoreline or attached to a dock as authorized by the owner of the shoreline or dock.

Sections 2 and 3 would make violation of the act a Class 2 misdemeanor, enforceable by law enforcement officers of the WRC, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and other peace officers with general subject matter jurisdiction.

Section 4 would make the act applicable to Roanoke Rapids Lake in Halifax and Northampton Counties only.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective October 1, 2019, and would apply to offenses committed on or after that date.
